REQUIREMENTS: A High School Student, continuing education for the Fall 2026. Experience in landscaping: cutting grass, planting flowers, shrubs, weeding, clearing stones, manual labor. Applicant needs ability to follow directions, accept challenges and responsibilities.

Kanien'keha language is an asset. This position requires an individual who will perform the requested duties responsibly and with flexibility in meeting the demands involved in working with the public and weather conditions. The student will work in a smoke-free environment.

RESPONSIBILITIES: Provide assistance to groundskeepers in landscaping and golf course maintenance. Daily grass cutting, cleaning & cultivating land, bunkers, fairways, teeing grounds, greens & pond surround. In addition, student will maintain the walk and parking lot area. Building and machinery care, maintenance, cleaning and upkeep will also be involved. Kanien'keha language will be encouraged, supported and reinforced. TRAINING/WORK PLAN:

In general, working on a golf course requires an individual who is able to work outside. Experiences will be acquired and practiced throughout the work program. Student will be learning a variety of golf course grounds keeping skills which will include grass cutting, daily cleaning sand traps and greens, maintaining tee's and fairways, repairing divots, pulling weeds out of cultivated areas, clean parking lot, clubhouse, grounds and buildings, sorting recyclable materials.

In addition to the following which will happen as the need arises over course of employment:

WEEK 1-2: Orientation to work on a Golf Course and public relations. Instruction/training/safe use of machinery (mowers, edger, whippersnipper, etc.) Daily requirements involve care of sand traps, tee's, fairways and greens (inspecting for damages and reporting to supervisor) Daily cleaning benches/refuse bins on the course.

WEEK 3-4: Proper guidance in divot repair and watering requirements Introduction to preparing reports using the computer and online transmission. Attend to proper recycling methods by sorting and bagging recyclable materials

WEEK 5-6: Raking and cleaning area around Clubhouse, storage areas Cleaning and inspecting machinery under the guidance of course manager Clean, inspect, report damages and repair golf course furniture, ball washers & disposal units throughout the grounds

WEEK 7-8: Work with Greenskeepers to inspect, maintain and operation of irrigation system, paint buildings, equipment and machinery as needed clean maintenance sheds, garages and attend to proper storage of tools and equipment
