- Attend meetings of the Intercollegiate Network of English CEGEPS/Universities in the greater Montreal area;
- To share best practices and experiences from an Indigenous students' perspective and learn from the experiences of other students attending those post-secondary institutions;
- Develop and implement a recruitment and orientations plans in the community of Kahnawake, includes but not limited to school visits to promote post-secondary education and share their experiences – before CEGEP application deadlines and at the end of the semester for future student orientations;
- To design the schedule of activities for the Truth & Reconciliation activities planned for the week and day of September 30, 2026;
