Construction Trades Students demonstrate their training

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: Kahnawà:ke (July 2, 2013) Tewatohnhi'saktha announced that starting today, twelve of the recently graduated Introduction to Construction Trades (ICT) participants will be participating in a Work Experience project by using their skills to build 8' x 12' storage sheds. Interested community members will have the opportunity to purchase some of these – and everyone will have the opportunity to win one via raffle. They will also be working on other small projects.

The Introduction to Construction Trades Program gives students learning experience in welding, plumbing, carpentry, and electricity, and all hours from the course can be applied to a MELS-accredited program of their choice in any of those fields. This project will give the students real on-the-job experience and allow them to demonstrate their knowledge of the trades.

The business will be located in the eastern end of the Services Complex parking lot from July 2 to July 26, 2013, from 8:00 a.m. – 3:30 p.m, and the project office will be located on the ground floor of the Kahnawà:ke Business Complex. Students participating in the project will be provided an enhanced training allowance and be covered by Mohawk Self-insurance. The project will be administrated by ICT coordinator Kim Delormier and supervised by Tim Clancy, an experienced carpenter from Chateauguay, who will be assisted by Roiahtate Horn.

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
