

ONÁ:KE PADDLING CLUB – <u>CANOE CAMP ANIMATOR - 2024</u>

The Canoe Camp Animator will be responsible to oversee the daily and weekly Canoe Kids activities at the Oná:ke Paddling Club, as put forth by the Senior Manager of the Oná:ke Paddling Club and the Summer Camp Co-Ordinator. He/she will also be expected to be punctual and follow the set work schedule.

Other duties will also include:

- to ensure proper supervision and safety on and off the water, for all who participate.
- to ensure that the club, the boats and surrounding area are clean and safe.
- will follow all the safety procedures as put forth by the Senior Manager at Onake.
- will be expected to actively participate in all activities that are organised for the Youth and Adults at the Oná:ke Paddling Club.
- may possibly be asked to work shifts, which may include occasional weekends.
- will help to monitor 'Family Night' to the Community.
- will be encouraged to use Kanien'keha to the participants and Community.

The Camp Animator must understand that the main objective for the Oná:ke Paddling Club will be to safely offer canoeing activities to the Youth, Adults and Families of Kahnawà:ke. All Onake staff will be encouraged and expected to initiate activities in regard to Canoeing and Fitness and the use of Kanien'keha at the Oná:ke Paddling Club is highly encouraged for all staff.

Education Required: Minimum of 1 year 'coaching/ animating' experience, Bronze Medallion Water Safety, CPR, First Aid and Motorboat Safety, Kanien'keha and French as a 2nd language is an asset.
