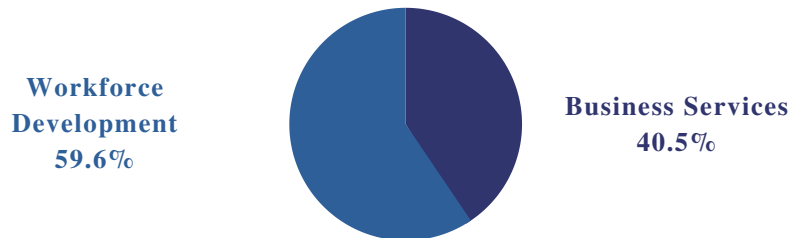

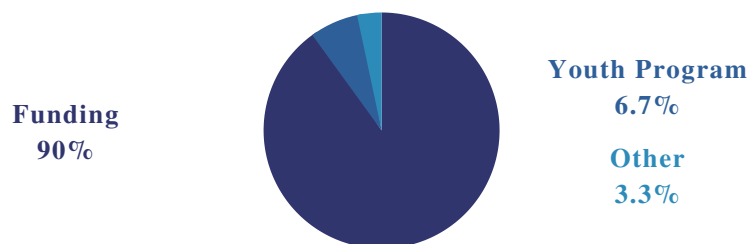

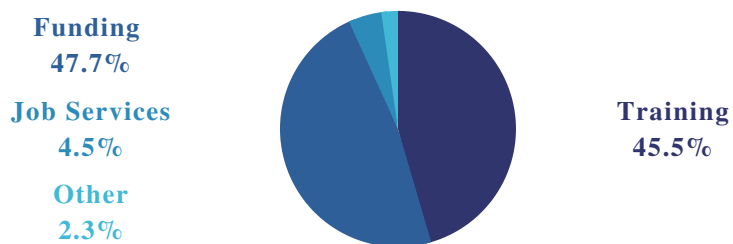
During your last visit to Tewatohnhi'saktha, from which of the following departments did you access services?



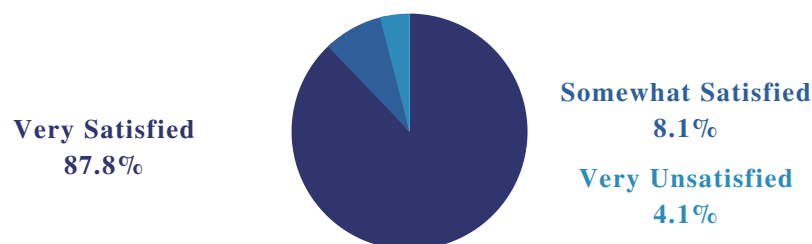
Which of the following Business Services did you access?

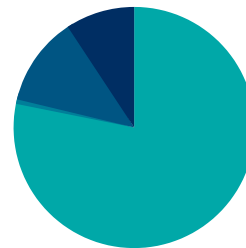

BUSINESS SUPPORT DURING COVID-19 PANDEMIC

A total of \$228,450.23 was disbursed in Q1 for the Emergency Relief Measures Fund for Businesses, the breakdown is as follows

- Business Interruption Fund: \$178,529.61
- Fit Up: \$1,382.76
- Rent: \$27,331.01
- Working Capital: \$21,206.85
