The event took place at the Kahnawà:ke Sports Complex, where activities and vendors had been set up throughout the day. The social scheduled for 7PM was relocated to the 207 Longhouse, due to the heavy rain, where a great turn out of people came together. CBC and CTV News also showed up for the day to conduct interviews with Tourism, Kanien'kehá:ka Onkwawén:na Raotitióhkwa Language and Cultural Center and the vendors. Community members and visitors alike enjoyed the event and hope to see a recurrence in the future.

It can be estimated that twenty-five (25) tour vouchers had been distributed to the community and visitors alike.

In all the event went well and everyone had a great time. The Kahnawà:ke Fire Brigade came in 2nd place.






#### Tour Updates

The tourism office received a total number of 332 visitors for scheduled private tours with our tour guides. We had five school groups from the New Frontiers School Board, two personal tours for families living in Montreal, one college school group from Kings College in Pennsylvania organized by St. Josephs, three groups from Insight Global Education from BC and Toronto. We also had a tour from Kahnawà:ke Shakotiia'takehnhas Community Services (KSCS) and representatives from the Governor General of Canada.

We also received numerous walk-in tours for the month of June with a total of twenty-five (25) visitors.



**51 Total Visitors**; **22** from Canada; **1** from Mississauga, **1** from Newmarket, **2** from Toronto, and **2** from North Vancouver. We had **7** visitors from the United States; **3** from Michigan, **2** from Syracuse, **1** from Cherokee Nation, and **1** from Virginia. We also had **10** visitors from France, **10** from Germany, and **2** from Australia.

Over the past month tours where held almost every day, sometimes two or three. We receive visitors from everywhere in the world which makes for some interesting tours and discussions.

The Kanien'kehá:ka people were represented at the 5th edition of KWE à la rencontre des peoples autochtones (meet with Indigenous Peoples) by Tourism Development Agent, Kimberly Cross, local artist & beader, Phyllis Fazio-Mayo, dancer Barbara Diabo, and local crafter, Preston Jacobs. The event was held in Quebec City, at the Parc Jean-Beliveau on June 16 – 21. KWE! is where all 11 nations in Quebec are represented by shows, dancing, singing, crafting, and by our people, on site to talk about our cultures and communities. Thousands of people attended the event over the five (5) days where information was given, discussions were hot and fun was had by all! While Kimberly had the cultural and tourism information set up, Phyllis was on site demonstrating beadwork. Barbara Diabo, a well known and talented fancy and hoop dancer, was a performer with one of the entertainment artists in the evening shows. Preston had the amazing task of building and animating a traditional longhouse!


