Vendors at the market included arts and crafts, apparel and accessories,



health and beauty, and visits to their library. Lunch was prepared by Chef Tawnya Brant, from the Grand River Territory in Six Nations . She is a competitor from season 10 of Top Chef Canada. Proceeds raised from the event will help fund a cookhouse for the Oshweken Mohawk Longhouse.

# THE COP (CONFERENCE OF PARTIES) 15 YOUTH SUMMIT





The Youth Summit was held on December 5th & 6th and organized by the Global Youth Biodiversity Network (GYBN). The summit featured many speakers, both international and local in regards to the current biodiversity conflict. There was an opening ceremony conducted by Otsi'tsaken:ra, followed with various speeches. Workshops were held throughout the entirety of the two-day conference bringing youth together in groups to brainstorm ideas regarding the current state of our biodiversity throughout the world. Tehoniè:ien, a local indigenous youth, spoke on the connection between biodiversity and our culture Kanien'kehá:ka people. Hila The Killa, an eco-rapper made a few appearances as well during the conference, rapping about biodiversity. The second day of the conference was mainly panel discussions related to biodiversity.





# THE CONFERENCE OF PARTIES (COP15) INDIGENOUS PAVILION/VILLAGE

The Indigenous Pavilion/Village was held on December 9th to the 11th in the Old Port. An opening ceremony took place at the pavilion by Ka'nahsohon Deer, elder. There was beautiful attractions as well as performances and speakers that included special guests such as Dr. David Suzuki. The Kahnawà:ke Tourism team met with many people from across the world. Traditional structures were erected on the grounds of the conference area which included; a longhouse display, a small tipi, a metashan, and a large shaputuan. The longhouse display was created by Preston Jacobs, from Kahnawà:ke; a main attraction at many tourism events. There had been many musical performances as well as a show by Don Barnaby, a local dancer, singer, and artisan.

It was a quiet month with less than 10 visitors dropping by the Welcome Center with some from as close as Quebec and as far as China.

A tour was held on December 18th at the Cultural Center with Vanuatu's minister for climate change and the CEO of the Jane Goodall Institute.




