# \$1.4 million received to launched a new trades program, "Builders of the Future"

Tewatohnhi'saktha, in partnership with the First Nations Regional Adult Education Center, and the New Frontiers and Lester B. Pearson School Boards, will launch the first cohort of the NEW program "Builders of the Future" in response to the demand for certified carpenters, electricians and plumbers. This project is funded in part by the Government of Canada's Skills and Partnership Fund.

The first cohort will begin in the Fall of 2023, and each program will be 6-months long. Students will gain approximately 600 hours of study followed by potential work placements in these fields.

On June 16th the latest cohort from the Carpentry Program completed with 5 graduates. 2 graduates are currently on work measures through our programs, 1 has returned to work, and 1-2 will be returning to school in the fall.




#### **The Cultural Arts Center**

The Kahnawà:ke Cultural Arts Center's Capital Campaign and current project management, is ongoing! The Building committee, consisting of the Kanien'kehá:ka Onkwawén:na Raotitióhkwa Language and Cultural Center, Turtle Island Theatre, Kahnawà:ke Tourism and the Mohawk Council of Kahnawà:ke, have been meeting weekly to determine final design of the interior, exterior, – basically everything! This new space will feature a state of the art museum, theatre, and a gathering space for community. We are working diligently to ensure the new center meets all our present and future needs. The architectural firms, Brook Mcllroy & Provencher\_Roy have been hired and have provided thus far some amazing conceptual drawings.
