HOLIDAY TRAIN

Kahnawà:ke Tourism joined in on the festivities for this year's Canadian Pacific Kansas City Holiday Train which rolled into Adirondack Junction on November 23rd. The weather was great for the occasion, bringing many visitors from outside the community to watch a musical performance by Virginia to Vegas. Derik John Baker from the group made a special mention of our sister community Tyendinaga and was happy to now be playing in front the Kahnawà:ke audience. We would like to thank all who came out and are very happy to report that this stop of the Holiday Train raised \$4,500 for the Kateri Food Basket. The donations will certainly go a long way to helping those in need this holiday season.



TOURS

With the tour season slowly coming to an end, Kahnawà:ke Tourism welcomed four tour groups in November. They were shown around by our bilingual Tour Guide and Event Coordinator, Bronwyn Johns.

On Monday, November 13, 2023, Bronwyn guided 10 staff members from CAE Inc., a company which develops digital simulation training applications for its customers in the civil aviation, healthcare, defense and security fields. CAE Inc. started their day meeting with Tewatohnhi'saktha to discuss potential future programming for students interested in aviation. The group continued their visit to Messy Kitchen to enjoy a hot on-the-go meal before beginning their tour of Kahnawà:ke and were then guided through the Language and Cultural Center.



On Thursday, November 16, 2023 Bronwyn conducted a tour for 3 staff from the McGill Faculty and Chief Peacekeeper Dwayne Zacharie of the Kahnawà:ke Peacekeepers on a three hour guided tour. The group began their visit learning the history of Kahnawà:ke before heading to the Saint Francis Xavier Mission to see the shrine of Saint Kateri Tekakwitha. The group finished their visit at the Language and Cultural Center where they were shown around and learned more about our history and culture.

On Tuesday, November 21, 2023 Bronwyn and Kimberly, Kahnawà:ke Tourism Development Manager, guided a familiarization tour for PlanIt Consulting along with 20 potential donors looking to

invest in the new Cultural Arts Center building project. The group visited Kateri Hall to view the current Turtle Island Theatre, Saint Francis Xavier Mission, and the Quebec Bridge Monument. They were also given a tour of the community including Kahnawà:ke Survival School, the grounds of the future building site, The People's Fire, and a stop at the temporary location of the Language and Cultural Center.

On Wednesday, November 29, 2023 Bronwyn guided a group of 23 visitors from United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), which endeavor to enhance peace and security by promoting international cooperation in education, sciences, culture, communication and information. The group was attending a conference in Montreal and before heading back to New Jersey, the group reached out to Kahnawà:ke Tourism interested in learning more about our community. They were shown around the Language and Cultural Center to learn about the people of Kahnawà:ke and our culture.


