We kicked things off with our first-ever Hour of Inclusion, setting a welcoming and inclusive tone for all guests. Visitors explored hands-on workshops, such as a Black Ash Tree Flower Splint Workshop with Robin Lazore, and an engaging natural medicine talk with Elaine Delaronde, who shared knowledge about traditional healing plants from our land.

A crowd favorite was the Strawberry Bobbing Contest! Ten brave participants raced to scoop up seven floating strawberries—Diana from Sweet

Dee's claimed victory and a \$50 Shop Kahnawà:ke gift certificate.

The fun continued with the Best Strawberry Jam Contest, where local jam-makers showcased their best. Louise Bonspille took home the top prize and another \$50 Shop Kahnawà:ke gift certificate!

Foodies were in for a treat with strawberry-themed creations catered by Simple Pleasures and Berrylicious through Kahnawà:ke Tourism. Guests enjoyed a berry upside-down cake from Simple Pleasures and fluffy strawberry-filled fried bread topped with whipped strawberry butter from Berrylicious. CITY OF MONTREAL INDIGENOUS DAY DECLARATION

On June 16, Kimberly was honoured to attend the City of Montréal's formal declaration recognizing National and Montréal Indigenous Peoples Day, held annually on June 21. This powerful statement reaffirms the city's commitment to reconciliation, respect for Indigenous rights, and meaningful partnerships with First Nations, Inuit, and Métis communities. With acknowledgment of the city's location on unceded Kanien'kehà:ka land, the declaration celebrates Indigenous contributions to the cultural and social fabric of Montréal. It also highlights continued efforts to combat systemic discrimination and promote Indigenous leadership, language, and heritage.

Kimberly recently attended the Indigenous Tourism Quebec board meeting in Wendake, where board members gathered to hear updates on the Getiget Project, the current action plan, and the 2022–2027 strategic plan. The meeting provided a valuable space for reflection and future planning. KWE FESTIVAL 2025

A Celebration of Culture, Identity, and Solidarity

From June 13–15, we joined the KWE Festival at Place Jean-Béliveau in Quebec City for a vibrant and meaningful weekend of cultural sharing. The event kicked off on Friday with an opening ceremony featuring a powerful drum performance by Northern Voice and dancers from Wendake's youth group, setting the tone for a weekend of celebration and education.

Under sunny skies, visitors of all ages walked the Knowledge Trail of the 11 Nations, engaging with representatives from each nation through skill demonstrations that highlighted diverse cultural identities. We had the honour of representing our nation alongside our sister community of Kanehsatà:ke. Along the trail, this year's new feature—the Garden of Hearts—offered a moment of reflection and solidarity. Guests placed colored hearts to support significant causes: purple for Joyce's Principle, orange for Every Child Matters, and red in memory of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women (MMIW).

Culinary delights were provided by Chef Maxime Lizotte of the Wolastoqiyik Wampanoag Nation, who served dishes such as Three Sisters Chili Con Carne, Barbec-Kwe Grilled Chicken, and Warrior Potatoes, delighting the crowd and celebrating Indigenous foodways.

Throughout the weekend, the sound of the drum and the voices of singers from various nations united participants in a shared spirit of culture and community. The team is already looking forward to returning next year to represent the Kanien'kehá:ka Nation once again.



TOURISM MONTÉRÉGIE SUMMER LAUNCH

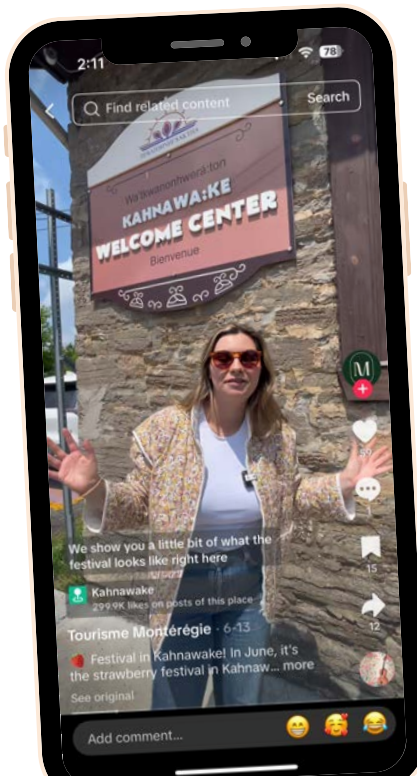

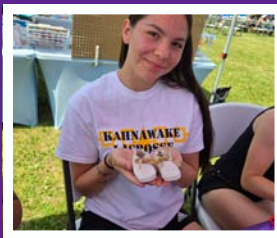
INDIGENOUS DAY CELEBRATION

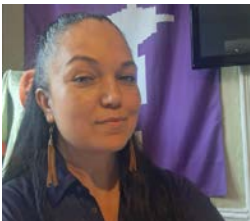

June 5 – ALCOA Staff

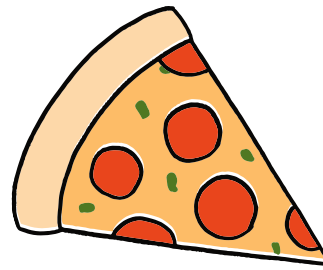
8 staff members joined Tour Guide Roxann Whitebean for a historic village tour.

TOURISM UPDATE

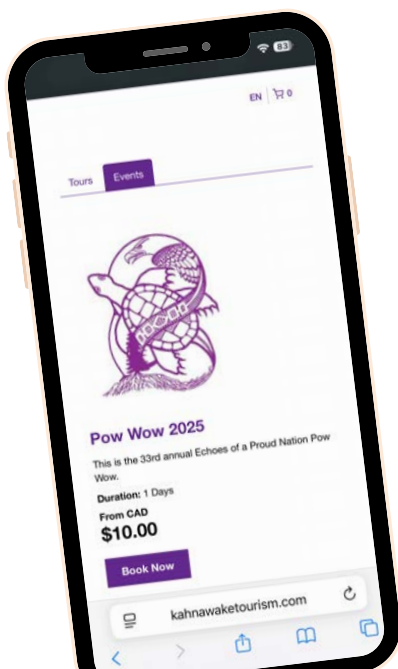
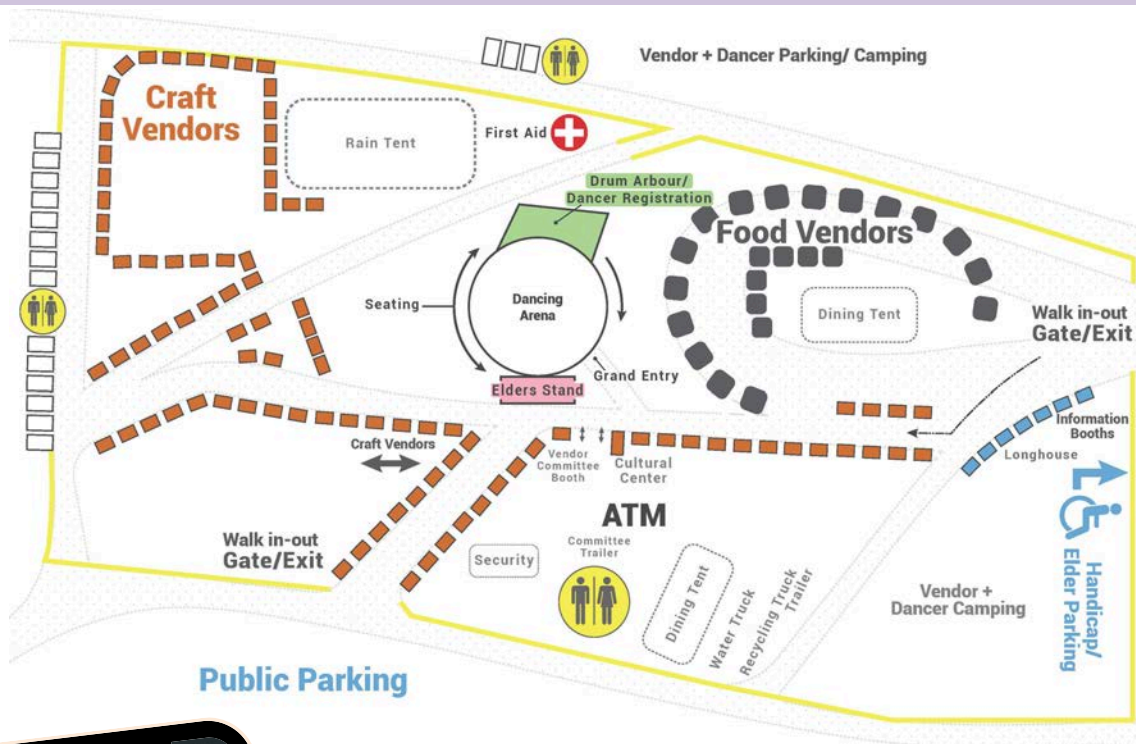
